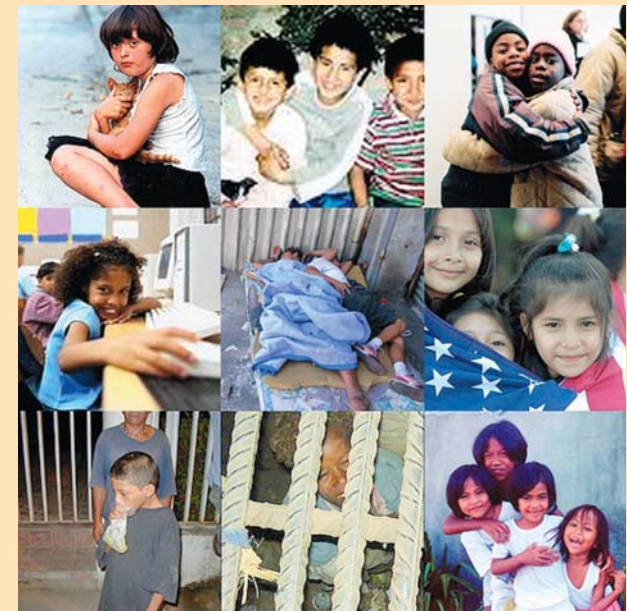

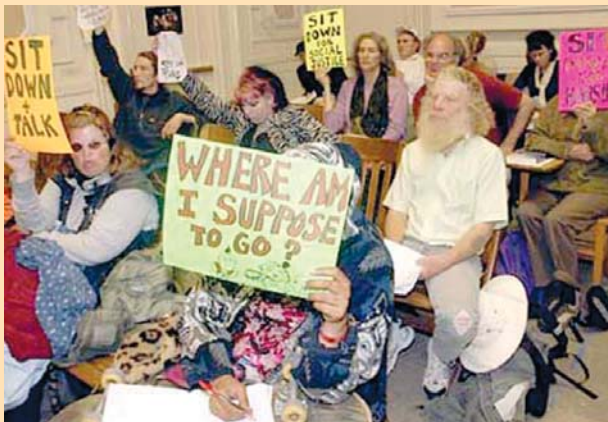

Core to our way of life is the sanctity of shelter. Stable families in happy homes represent the primary support upon which this great nation stands. Our Generation has the solemn responsibility to pull this nation once again through an economic crisis. It is thus crucial that we keep as many pillars as we can in place. Now more than ever.

We are committed to assisting our beneficiaries at every conceivable stage of potential homelessness.



Home Rescue Initiative.

We are being inundated by the foreclosure crisis in the media. So many homes are in foreclosure status, and homeowners are suffering and struggling to make ends meet and keep up with agreed payments.

What most home owners don't know is there exists now a variety of programs to assist with the challenge home ownership and payment relief. We at the Volunteer Society seek now to develop workshops geared towards engaging real estate, banking and mortgage professionals to seek singular creative solutions for the vast numbers of home owners that reach out to us for assistance.

Family Transition Program.

The sad truth is that several families, despite our best efforts, will lose their homes, often times as a result of income loss.

Sometimes all a breadwinner needs is a week or two of focus and stability to secure work and alternative accommodation.

We at the Volunteer society seek in partnership with hotels and Inns in and around Urban country to set up our Family transition units where such hardworking men and women may leave their families in our care while they address their vital needs and reintegrate themselves back into society without loss of face or dignity.

Each transition unit at a participating hotel costs us \$1400 per week for accommodation and feeding for qualifying families. We seek to offer such assistance to 500 such families a year.

Where longer periods are anticipated we seek to set up Transition Centers which may accommodate 5 families at a time for up to 3 months. Each transition center costs us

\$750,000.00 to set up and \$100,000 a year to run. We seek to set up 10 of such centers every year.

Job loss and home loss need not end up with the tragedies all too often reported on Television.

Critical Intervention For the Homeless.

We seek to aggressively address the needs of the homeless.

Our approach requires an in depth assessment of each homeless beneficiary to seek the most efficient path to restoration, shelter and self sustenance.

Some may need psychiatric care, some substance abuse and alcohol rehabilitation. Some may simply need a bed, shower, a change of clothes, a point in the right direction, and an ear to listen in and monitor progress.

Our proposed critical intervention centers will be set up in areas of prevalent homelessness and will be the command and planning center for our intervention initiatives working in hand with other non profit organizations to seek and qualify these neglected but precious members of society for urgent and necessary care.

We seek to process and direct at least 500 homeless people a year.

Our first phase of measurable action will be to have our volunteers equip them with unlimited prepaid cell phones and if they permit us, GPS tracking devices so that we may monitor and track progress as we qualify them for available rehabilitation and work to get them off the streets, under shelter and back to work.

We seek to establish three prototype command centers at a cost of \$350,000.00 each.

It is time for us to stop pretending that the homeless don't exist or are on the streets by their own choice.
